<u>HrMs O 21</u> (Lt.Cdr. J.F. van Dulm, RNN) and <u>HrMs O 22</u> (Lt.Cdr. J.W. Ort, RNN) both conducted exercises off Dundee with <u>HMS White Bear</u> (Capt. R. Gill, RNR). (4)

She was escorted to position 56°42'N, 07°54'E by <u>HMS White Bear</u> (Cdr.(Retd.) C.C. Flemming, RN). They parted company at 0800/7. (8)

HMS Tuna (Lt.Cdr. M.K. Cavenagh-Mainwaring, DSO, RN) departed from Holy Loch for her 4th

war patrol. She was ordered to patrol in the Bay of Biscay. During the passage south through the Irish Sea she was escorted by <u>HMS White Bear</u> (Cdr.(Retd.) C.C. Flemming, RN) until 0200/14.
